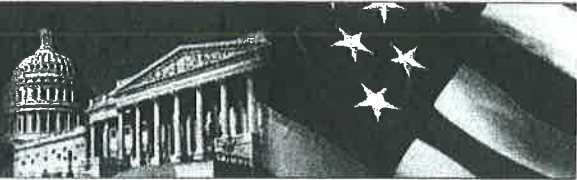

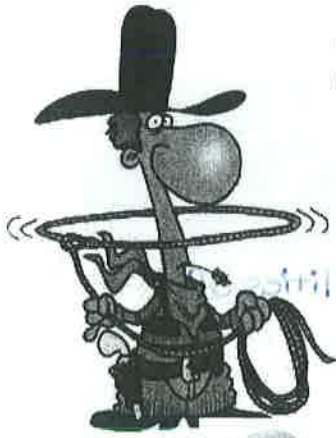

Civic Responsibilities:

- ▲ Register and Vote
- ▲ Hold elected office
- ▲ Influence government by communicating with government officials
- ▲ Serve in voluntary or appointed positions
- ▲ Participate in political campaigns
- ▲ Keep informed regarding current issues
- ▲ Respect other's rights to an equal voice in government



Civic duties = Mandatory

6 th Amendment -	speedy + public trial
7 th Amendment	trial by jury
8 th Amendment	No cruel / unusual punishment
10 th Amendment	state powers (reserved)

Due Process of Law -

due process - A constitutional protection against unfair government actions.

5th Amendment - Protects our due process rights against the National Government

14th Amendment - Protects our due process rights against the State Governments

The Due Process clause protects the guarantees of the Bill of Rights.
